Crontab

List active cron jobs

```
crontab -l  
less /etc/crontab
```

Systemctl restart crond

View Cron Jobs by User

```
sudo crontab -u username -l
```

How to List Hourly Cron Jobs

```
ls -la /etc/cron.hourly
```

How to List Daily Cron Jobs

```
ls -la /etc/cron.daily
```

How to Display Weekly Cron Jobs

```
ls -la /etc/cron.weekly
```

How to List Monthly Cron Jobs

```
ls -la /etc/cron.monthly
```

So the rule is **always use full paths in crontab:**

```
22 10 * * * root /usr/bin/scp -i /home/username/.ssh/id_rsa -r /var/www/abc abc@ip:/home/abc
```

Explanation of the Date/Time fields

The first five fields of the line are the date and time field which specify how frequently and when to execute a command. When adding the cron job in the DreamHost panel, the Date/Time is added for you automatically based on your 'When to run' setting.
